2. Be Honest About Your Needs and Limitations

Hosting doesn't have to mean doing it all yourself. It is okay to ask for help in planning and leading your group as well as with logistical issues such as cleaning, preparing refreshments, and setting up a space.

3. Don't Overdo It

Creating a welcoming and warm space will require effort. However, your home does not have to be immaculate. Don't let extraneous details become an idol.

4. Create an Intimate and Welcoming Space

Creating the right space for a small group will ensure that the group meets the spiritual needs of everyone involved.

5. Minimize Interruptions

Interruptions will keep the group from fully engaging with each other. Turn off televisions, telephones, and electronic distractions. Put your pets away in another room or in a crate. Ask group members to silence phones as well.

6. Know Your Faith Community's Expectations

Different churches have different expectations of group leaders. Some expect you to host in your home while others will provide a space.

7. Reject Worry

It's easy to worry about hosting. You may worry that your home is not nice enough, that you are not capable of leading, that the group will not go as planned. These worries do nothing to prevent issues but they do steal your joy. Do your best and leave the rest up to God.

8. Be Flexible About Attendance

There is no way to control attendance, so handle changes gracefully. This is one area that is truly up to God. Welcome those who come warmly, show newcomers around, and follow up with those who don't attend later. Focus on making everyone in attendance feel wanted.

9. Add an Extra Layer of Prayer

Prayer is the best way to maintain joy in hosting. Pray while planning and setting up, pray after the group, and pray regularly for everyone involved. Pray that your group be a source of learning and spiritual growth. There are some things that we cannot control, so take it to God.

10. Keep the Focus on People

It's easy to forget group study is about people. Even if things don't go according to your plan, everything is according to a higher plan.
